80% Grant for Furloughed Workers – How does the Scheme Work?

1. Which employees qualify?

- 1. 80% of wages will be refunded as grant, up to a maximum of £2500 + related employers national insurance contributions and auto enrolment pension contributions.
- 2. You must have had a PAYE scheme in place on 28-02-2020.
- 3. Employees made redundant after 28-02-2020 can be re-employed and furloughed.
- 4. All businesses can claim unless your normal income comes from receiving public funding which has not stopped (quangos).
- 5. All employees present on the PAYE scheme on 28-02-2020 full time, part time, agency workers and zero hours. Employees starting after this date are excluded.
- 6. The furlough period must be a minimum of 3 weeks and maximum of 3 months.
- 7. Furloughed workers cannot do any work of any nature for your business or any other employer. They can however complete non-essential training.
- 8. Furloughed directors can continue to perform their Statutory Duties under Company Law.
- 9. When choosing who to furlough or to reduce hours, discrimination laws still apply.
- 10. Employees on unpaid leave at 28-02-2020 are excluded.
- 11. Employees on sick pay can only move to the furloughed scheme when they are fit for work.
- 12. Employees with more than one employer can receive multiple furloughed payments.
- 13. Maternity pay in excess of the SMP (paid at the discretion of the employer) qualifies for the scheme (the SMP does not).

2. Who loses out?

- 1. Director/shareholders on the dividend aspect of their monthly pay.
- 2. Individuals starting employment after 28-02-2020.
- 3. Individuals who changed jobs in March.

3. What can be claimed?

- 1. The grant of 80% is paid to the employer. The employer may choose to pay more, but not less than 80% to the employee.
- 2. Claims can be backdated to 01-03-2020 for any furloughed pay after that date.
- 3. Fees, commissions and bonuses must be excluded from the pay.
- 4. For employees with over 12 months service, the rate is the higher of:
 - 1. The same month's pay last year
 - 2. The average earnings in 2019-20
- 5. For employees with less than 12 months service, the rate is the average paid.
- 6. For employees starting work after 01-02-2019, pro rata/gross up their pay to a full month.



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- 4. How do you make a claim for the grant?
 - 1. Maximum number of claims is 1 every 3 weeks, immediately before or after the actual payments to your employees.
 - 2. You must maintain a schedule ready for the new systems being introduced which states:
 - 1. PAYE ref
 - 2. #no. of employees being furloughed
 - 3. Period of claim
 - 4. Amount you are claiming for
 - 5. Your bank details
 - 6. Your business (as the claimant) details
 - 3. Paid by BACS into your account directly by HMRC

The grants are included in the taxable income of your business.

The precise method of submitting your claim is currently <u>unknown</u>
